

Nationally increasing rates of mental and behavioral health concerns in school age children and adolescents









National Mental Health Crisis

- Rate of Suicide among pediatric patients has increased by 50% over the last decade
- During 2020, the proportion of mental health-related emergency department (ED) visits among adolescents aged 12–17 years increased 31% compared to 2019
- April to October 2020 hospitals nationally saw a 24% increase in mental health ED visits for kids ages 5 to 11 years old
- Summer 2020: suspected suicide attempts increased 22.3% in patients 12-17 y/o patients









National Mental Health Crisis

 February 21–March 20, 2021, mean weekly ED visit counts for suspected suicide attempts were 50.6% higher among girls aged 12–17 years compared with the same period in 2019.

- Children's Hospital Colorado in Aurora <u>publicly declared</u> a state of emergency in pediatric mental health in May 2021
 - 72% increase in systemwide behavioral health emergencies
 - 90% increase in April alone compared to 2019.

Children's Hospital Colorado declares mental health state of emergency as suicide attempts rise

Suicide attempts are rising and emergency room visits for mental health crises were up 90% last month. Mental health experts are asking for help.


FIGURE 1. Numbers of weekly emergency department visits* for suspected suicide attempts[†] among adolescents aged 12–17 years, by sex — National Syndromic Surveillance Program, United States, January 1, 2019-May 15, 2021 1,200 A. Girls 1,000 800 No. of weekly ED visits 600 400 2021 2020 2019 Winter surveillance period 200 Spring surveillance period Summer surveillance period 21 23 25 27 29 5 9 13 31 33 35 37 39 Week no.










Suicides California Residents 10-17 years by Age, 2017-2019


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Suicides California Residents 10-17 years by Mechanism, 2017-2019




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Crude Suicide Rates California Residents 10-17 years by Race/Ethnicity, 2017-2019






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Suicides Los Angeles County Residents 10-17 years by Mechanism, 2017-2019








Suicides Orange County Residents 10-17 years by Age, 2017-2019








Suicides Orange County Residents 10-17 years by Mechanism, 2017-2019
