





COVID-19 INDUSTRY GUIDANCE:

Schools and School-Based Programs

Release date: July 17, 2020

- Establish procedures to arrange for safe transport home or to a healthcare facility, as appropriate, when an individual is exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms:
 - o Fever
 - Cough

- o Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- o Chills
- o Repeated shaking with chills
- o Fatigue
- o Muscle pain
- o Headache
- Sore throat
- o Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- o Diarrhea
- New loss of taste or smell

STUDENTS


Age	Face Covering Requirement
Under 2 years old	No
2 years old – 2 nd grade	Strongly encouraged**
3 rd grade – High School	Yes, unless exempt

^{**}Face coverings are strongly encouraged for young children between two years old and second grade, if they can be worn properly. A face shield is an acceptable alternative for children in this cohort who cannot wear them properly.

When Would a School Be Closed? CDPH Guidance:

"Individual school closure may be appropriate when there are multiple cases in multiple cohorts at a school or when at least 5 percent of the total number of teachers/student/staff are cases within a 14-day period, depending on the size and physical layout of the school."





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
