





AAP-CA official statement supporting returning kids to in-class learning

- Based on school safety practices,
 NOT case rates
- OC Safe School Restart team reviews school safety protocols
- AAP-OC supports vaccinating educators ASAP


CDPH Guidelines start 2/26/21

- Sport risk profiles based on risk of transmission
- Community transmission tier considered
- Recommended routine COVID-19 testing
- Face coverings
 - Always: Sideline athletes, observers, coaches
 - Variable: During athletic activity


